CFFA POSITION PAPER ON PROPOSED FARMINGTON RIVER WATER DIVERSION

The Connecticut Fly Fishermen's Association wishes to go on record as being firmly opposed to the present plan for the Farmington River diversion tunnel as proposed by the MDC. We urge that the scheduled referendum be postponed and that the environmental impact be completely re-evaluated before matters proceed. We also insist that future needs be rigidly documented by the MDC. We suggest that many signs point to a levelling off of population growth and water consumption in central Connecticut, and point out that lawns were watered all summer long in West Hartford this year, a year of acknowledged drought conditions!

CFFA also wishes to go on record as pledging its support in whatever way it can if the Farmington River Watershed Association or the Department of Environmental Protection feel that litigation is necessary.




Hook: Mustad 9074 mb or #4
Weighing: #1 Fuse Wire
Thread: Black
Tail: Olive Marihou
Body: it yellow sparkle yarn
Ribbing: Gold chain tinsel
Underwing: Olive Bucktail
Wing: Olive Mariboo



- Weigh hook tie in tips of two Maribod feathers: prepare to tie in as shown in Figure A. be more natural ourwes of the quills are as shown in Figure B.
- Tie in tail feathers, pull quille forward, tighten and cinch down and gut tail length to one hook gape, see Figure C.
- 3. Tie in body caterial and ribbing and make body.
- 4. Tie in anall amount of Olive Sucktail, tips should reach to about middle of the tail, the purpose of this backtail is to support the Olive Maribou wing.
- 5. Propare Natibou feather isparse tie) or feathers (dense tio) as shown in Figure D.
- 6. The in with quill curve(a) as shown in Figure E. pull quill(s) forward so tips of maribou extend just beyond the Bucktails tighten. cinch down, trim quill(a) and finish head.







I developed this pattern to use in a lake I fish were the bass are even more cannibalistic than usual - it worked and, further, it has proven <u>excellent</u> in several other places (it should be good for Rancho Seco, Indian Valley and Martis Lake - but I haven't been able to fish them with it yet). Suggested variantions: Black underwing (a closer immitation of a small bass). Yellow or White underwing for a Chub immitation. As it is, it is a deadly general minnow pattern. Honest.

& How to Correct Them

GOLDEN SPREAD FLY FISHERS AMBRILLO, TEXAS

All of our casting difficulties result from casting faults. If you use the proper form, as described and illustrated previously, you will avoid most of them. All of us, however, occasionally get into bad habits. Some of the most common, that are particularly troublesome to beginners, are listed here along with suggested solutions for correcting them.

Low Back Cast

Cause Hitting the water or ground on the back cast is caused by continuing to apply power too long through a wide arc, thereby driving the line down; also by insufficient line speed to turn over the back cast.

Correction Make the back cast with a brisk backward movement, holding the wrist stiff. Stop power application abruptly when the rod reaches the one o'clock position.

Wind Knots

Cause Most commonly, knots in the leader are caused by "punching" the rod during power application.

Correction Concentrate on accelerating the rod smoothly through its arc; don't apply all the power at once.

Hooking Line, Hitting Rod with Fly

Hooking the line or hitting the rod with the fly are caused by the same fault that ties knots in your leader. The correction is also the same.

Piling Up Line And Leader At End Of Cast

Cause Piling up the line and leader is usually caused by an inefficient wide loop. By powering the rod through a wide arc (often from three o'clock to nine), a wide loop is formed which cannot transmit enough energy to fully straighten the line.

Correction Accelerate the rod brisky from 11 to one o'clock, stopping the rod abruptly at each end. Remember, don't let any line slip from your left hand during the power application, only after.

Snapping Off Fly

Cause Snapping off flies and cracking the leader on the back cast are caused either by starting the forward cast too soon, before the back cast has time to straighten, or else by failing to use sufficient force in the back cast. In this case, it would never straighten, no matter how long you waited.

Correction Watch the back cast and start the forward cast when line and leader are out straight behind. Use sufficient force in making the back cast so it will straighten.

Slapping Water

Cause Splashing the line, leader and fly down on the water, sometimes hard enough to sink a dry fly, is caused by aiming the forward cast too low.

Correction Tilt the arc of power application backward a little so the forward cast straightens two or three feet above the water, then settles gently. In other words, aim your cast higher.

Line Won't Go Out

Cause When the line won't go out and straighten, even 30 feet of it, one or both of two casting faults committed by all beginners are nearly always to blame. The first is waving the rod through a great wide arc, instead of pushing it briskly through a narrow one. The second fault is permitting line to slip through the guides during the application of power.

Correction Again, make sure that you are powering the rod through a narrow arc, not a wide one. If your loops are large, you are using a wide arced stroke. Having someone watch your cast and tell you what you are actually doing with the rod can be very helpful. Also, if you are working out line, you must not release the line from your left hand until the power application is completed.

FLY FISHING TIPS

The size of the fly is more important than the pattern. If rising fish are not striking at your fly then tie on a smaller one.



- 2. Fish cannot see you as well if you are between the sun and the fish, unless you cast a shadow over his home.
- 3. Always cast up stream with a dry fly. This quarantees a free float without leader drag.
- 4. In dry fly fishing your leader should sink and your line should float.
- 5. Cut double tapered lines in half and then back up the 45' half with 75 yds. of monofilament. 15 to 20 lb. will do. You now have a new fly line for the future.
- 6. Casting a fly rod is done with a stiff forearm and not with the wrist.


FLY RETRIEVER

o recover a fly caught in a tree you'll find this "gadget" a great help.

Stick end (A) in fly rod tip guide and place hook (B) over the branch fly is attached too. Remove rod and pull down the branch with chalk line (C)

When not in use, wrap chalk line around "gadget" between points (1) and (2).

Make from clothes hanger wire.



TO STRAIGHTEN A LEADER

Use a piece of leather that is small enough to fit into your fishing jacket but large enough to find when you want it. Holding the leader taut, rub the leather back and forth vigorously to create frictional heat that re moves the coils from the leader.


KNOTS YOU SHOULD KNOW

NAIL KNOT is used to tie the butt end of your leader to the forward end of your fly line.


Use either a tapered nail or a small piece of tubing.

Hold the line, leader and tapered nail or small piece of tubing along side each END OF FLY LINE other. #L Wind leader around nail or tubing, line and itself six times. Run end of leader back along nail or through tubing up under loops. #2. Pull both ends of leader tight. Slip nail or tubing out and retighten. #3. Finally, pull line and leader tight and clip ends close. CLIP EMD

IMPROVED CLINCH KNOT-stick the end of the leader thru eye and make five or more twists around standing = part of the line. Thrust end of leader between the eye and first loop and back through the big loop. Pull tight and clip end close. ==
