## Meeting Notice

CFFA's October meeting will be held at 7:30 P.M., Wednesday, October 14, at the Veteran's Memorial Clubhouse on Sunset Ridge Dr. in East Hartford. CFFA member Harry Haakonsen will present a film and slide program on Atlantic Salmon. Dr. Haakonsen is Coordinator of the Environmental Studies Program at Southern Connecticut State College, and has done research on Atlantic Salmon in Norway.

Dr. Haakonsen's program will consider the Atlantic Salmon fishery on both sides of the Atlantic, and the impact of human effects such as acid rain and deep sea drilling. Several fly tyers will be present before the meeting to demonstrate fly tying patterns and techniques.

#### From the Nifty Newsletter Northern Illinois Fly Tyers

#### AUSABLE CANOE CADDIS

Hook: 94840 or 94842-sizes 10 to 18 Thread: 6/0 Flymaster to match body color

Body: Poly or fur dubbing Wing: Deer Body hair.

 Dub a body of poly or fur from hook bend to the eye.

 Cut a bunch of deer body hair about as thick as a wooden match. Remove fuzzy underfur and stack so tips are even.

 Tie in hair so tips extend just past bend of hook. Keep the hair only on the top of the hook shank.

4. After wrapping hair three or four times at the eye move thread down about 1/8" towards the bend. Use only one spiral of thread.

 Again, take three or four turns of thread around the hair and body, forming a small "bubble" at the head of the fly.

6. Whip finish the fly at the rear tie, and coat the windings with head cement.

7. Trim the hair in front of the eye flush with the eye of the hook.




