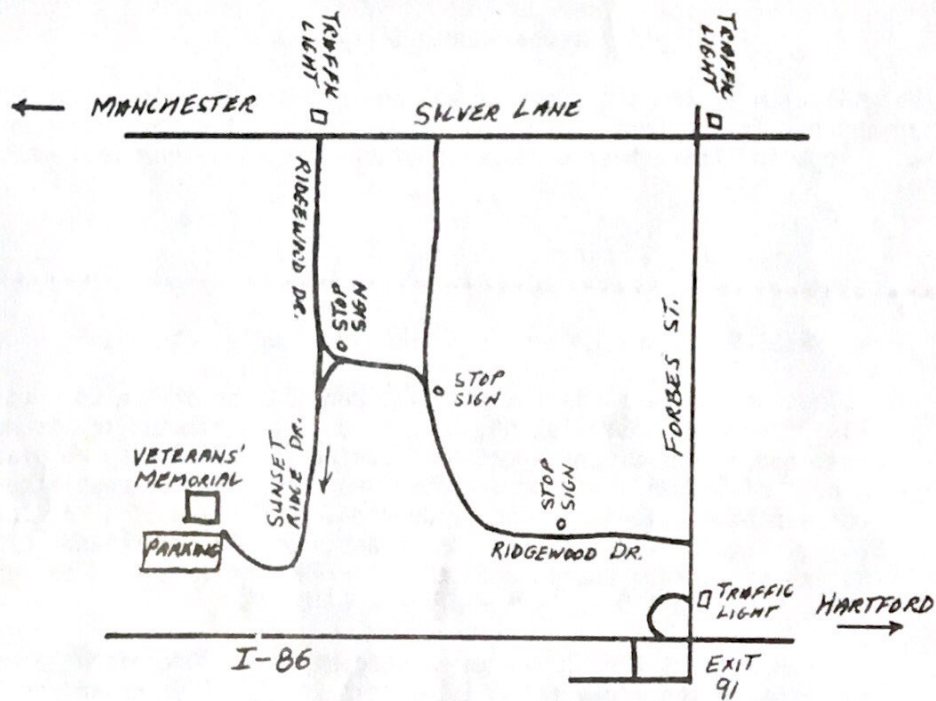

Jerry by the way is the manufacture, distributor, and holds the patent rights to the popular Regal Fly Tying Vise.

World's Fair Knot

This knot was created by Gary L. Martin of Lafayette, Ind. it was selected by a panel of outdoor writers as the best new, easy-to-tie, all-purpose fishing knot from 498 entries in the DuPont "Stren" fishing line "great knot search." Martin named it the World's Fair Knot because it was first publicly demonstrated by Gary Martin with Bill Dance and Roland Martin on June 4 at the Knoxville '82 World's Fair.

1. Double a 6" length of line and pass the loop through the eye.
2. Bring the loop back next to the doubled line and grasp the doubled line through the loop.
3. Put the tag end through the new loop formed by the double line.
4. Bring the tag end back through the new loop created by step 3.
5. Pull the tag end snug, slide knot up tight.

The World's Fair Knot is the winner of the DuPont "Stren" new knot contest that was announced on the bulletin board last Spring. Anybody think it will replace the clinch knot?

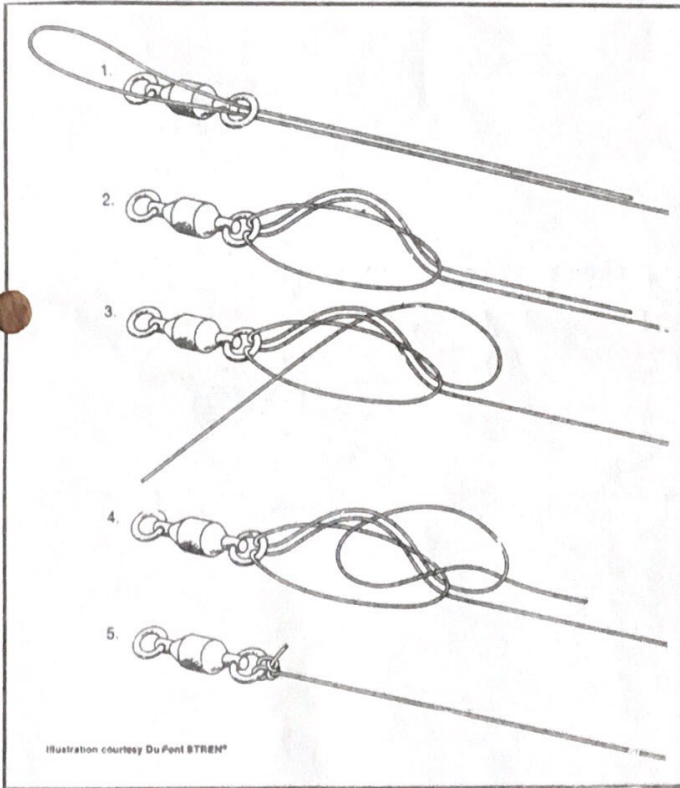

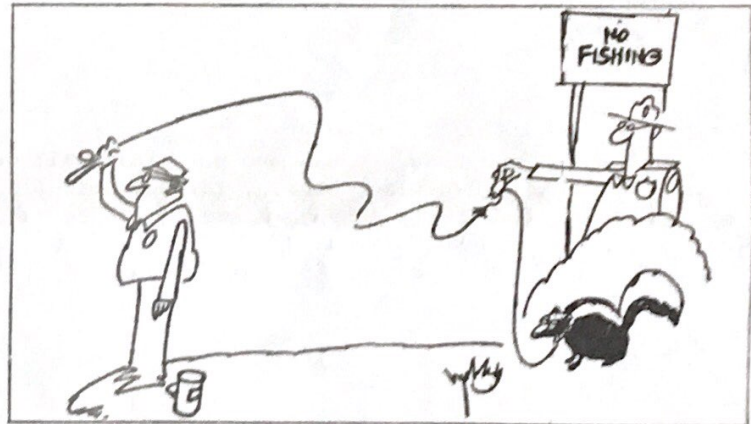
