UNEXPECTED STOCKING OF THE WILLI

Due to an unfortunate combination of low water in the New Britain water system and "micro" leaks in our trout rearing pool, we were not able to hold our 13 in. Bitterroot trout until Spring. The pump was started to aerate the water when the inflow rate dropped, but then the level of the rearing pool itself began to drop and the fish were moved to the Burlington Hatchery. The fish were placed in the upper part of the Trout Management Area in early November.

MATERIAL NEEDED FOR NEWSLETTER



FLY PATTERN OF THE MONTH

The following pattern is taken from May issue of the FFF newsletter.

CORK POPPER CONSTRUCTION

By Joe Aufderheide Indianapolis, IN

Editor's Note: Joe's poppers are meticulously made and he takes much pride in the finished product. Those that he sent for samples were very well done and caught several chunky largemouths at local lakes. Here are Joe's directions for his sark poppers. his cork poppers.

MATERIALS:

Mustad 33903 in sizes #2, 4, 8, 10 or Mustad 387187 wide gap in #2, 6, 10 Monocord thread 000 in assorted colors Assorted Sized Corks
Duco Cement
Fine Tooth Saw or #25GK Exacto Knife
Flexible Lacquers (Tackle Craft
Fluorescent Lacquers P.O. Box 280
Top Coat Lacquer (Chippena Falls, WI
1/4" Dowel Rod 54729-0280
Pencil Sharpner
Sandpaper or Emery Boards (easier to use) Assorted Paint Brushes



CONSTRUCTION STEPS:

- Select proper size cork to fit hook
- Make slot for hook exactly perpendicular to cork with exacto
- perpendicular to cork with exacto saw. Place hock shank into the slot with cement. Make sure cement is into slot and the shank of the hook is well covered with cement. When hook is properly positioned, let dry overnight. Inspect to see that proper amount of cement fills the slot, if not, fill the open slot with cement and let stand overnight again. Smooth cork and cement with emery board.

- poard.
 Using white flexible lacquer diluted 1:3
 paint a light coat onto the cork.
 Repeat #7 until a smooth finish is
 obtained. Let dry throroughly
 between each coat. Usually takes 3
 to 4 coats. 8.

- Apply color lacquer with brush as thin as you can. Let dry thoroughly. Usually takes three coats.
 Using a pencil sharpner sharpen a dowel rod so the point will make an eye size dot that will fit the popper.
 Paint an eye dot on either side of the
- head. Allow to dry.

 12. Apply a second dot of paint over the first with a smaller sharpened dowel
- 13. After drying, apply a thin coat of top coat. The top coat of Tackle Craft is excellent. You could also use Hard-As-Nails, clear nail polish, or clear polyurethane. Let dry 24 hours.

TO TIE TAIL:

- 2.
- Tie foundation of thread over hook.
 Cement.
 Select hackle of type and color desired.
 Tie in hackle points to form a "U". Make sure their length is approximately the length of shank of hook. Cement.
 Tie in hackle feather, wind around the hook bringing the finish wind next to butt of cork.
 Tie off with several single and double half hitches.
 Cement well. Keep cement off popper lacquer.

THE FOLLOWING COLORS WORK WELL:

Black
Brown
Chartreuse
White with black spots (Dalmation type)
White with red head
white with black head
yellow
yellow
with spots (white with oreen or yellow with spots (white with green or chartreuse)






COLE W. WILDE TROUT MANAGEMENT AREA DEDICATED

On Friday afternoon, September 19, 1986, a small group of family, friends and co-workers of the late Cole W. Wilde gathered at the east-bound rest stop on I-84 to rededicate the Willimantic Trout Management Area in his memory. The sign pictured above had been installed by Connecticut Department of Transportation workers that morning, right between the gate in the fence and our CFFA bulletin board. A similar sign had been placed in the Nye-Holman State Forest.

Cole began as an Aquatic Biologist in 1950, and rose to the position of Chief of the Fisheries Division in 1963, a position he held until his retirement in 1979. He had important roles in the Connecticut Lake and Pond Survey published in 1959, the design and construction of the Quinebaug Hatchery and development of Connecticut's stocking rate date. It was through his efforts that what is now the Trout Management Area became first restricted to fly fishing only (1974) and later to catch and release fishing (1976). The area was designated a special Trout Management Area in 1981, several years after his retirement.

Unfortunately, Cole Wilde passed away in the Fall of 1984. The Cole W. Wilde Trout Management Area will be a constant and fitting reminder of a friend of CFFA and all fishermen in Connecticut.
