CFFA Club Trip: There will be a members-only trip to the Connecticut Lakes Region on September 7-13, 1987. You may stay at Tall Timber Lodge or at a local campsite. The state campgrounds do not take reservations. Brook and rainbow trout fishing is available at Back Lake (Tall Timbers), other lakes in the area and the Connecticut River. Landlocks and Lake Trout can be found in the Connecticut Lakes. Licenses, flies, etc. are available at the lodge.

The cost at Tall Timber is \$38 per day for 1-3 days or \$36 per day for 4 or more days. This includes meals,lodging and maid service. A deposit of one day's cost is needed for reservations. More Books to Look At:Last month's issue listed more than enough books to keep you busy for a while. Some additional books to consider are:

Stoneflies, by Carl Richards, Doug Swisher and Fred Arbone; Dave Whitlock's Guide to Aquatic Trout Foods, by Dave Whitlock, Caddis Flies by Gary LaFonatine, Stoneflies for the Angler, by Eric Leiser and Robert H. Boyle, and The Caddis and the Angler, by Larry Solomon and Eric Leiser. If you fly fish and tie your own flies, you should take a look at The Hook Book, by "American Fly Tyer" publisher Dick Stewart. This little book describes all of the relevant hook models from Mustad, Eagle Claw, Kamasan, VMC, Tiemco and Partridge, including measurements, strength tests and full size illustrations. Just what you need if you're really fussy about getting the right hook for the job, or curious about what your options are.

FROM THE VEST OF THE PRESIDENT

Well the season has finally arrived. I hope you have all been successful. Did you get those anxious feelings in the pit of your stomach as you drove to the stream for the first time? Did you drive a little faster than you usually do? I did. In fact I guess I have these same feelings most of the time when I am on my way to go fishing.

Although the Willi has been high due to all the rain, the fishing has been pretty good. There have been some decent Hendrickson hatches along with a few Quill Gordons, Mahogany Duns and caddis. My first trout this year came through great skill and cunning. As I was taking the water temperature a fat rainbow wacked the streamer hanging in the surface film. Later I did catch four legitimately on drys.

I hope if you fish the Willimantic you will fill out a diary and check fin clips. The clips could be left or right pectoral (front) fins, left or right ventral (rear) fins, or the adipose fin, the small fin before the tail. This information is critical to the biologists to help them determine which strains are holding over and which rainbows don't migrate.

Mike Stewart still needs a couple more people to help at the outing on the Housatonic June 7th. If you can help the club call Mike at 653-4203. See you there.

1987 JUNIOR CONSERVATION CAMP

This year the Connecticut Fly Fishermens' Association will sponsor the attendance of one youth at a one-week Junior Conservation Camp held at Camp Workcoeman in New Hartford, Connecticut, during the month of August.

The Junior Conservation Camp gives boys twelve through fourteen years of age an opportunity to gain education in the proper use of our natural resources, the safe use of firearms, woodsmanship, fly fishing, fly tying, camping, boat safety, archery, skeet shooting and more. All of the training comes from experienced and well-trained instructors.

The Connecticut Wildlife Federation developed the conservation camp program. The camp staff is composed of well-qualified adults from throughout the state who donate their time and talents to this worthwhile project. There is one counselor for every ten boys.


This year the tuition is approximately \$125.00. CFFA will provide full tuition for the one boy that it sponsors. The tuition includes health and accident insurance, buses for various field trips and all instructional materials needed for the week.

Any boy between the ages of twelve and fourteen, in the immediate family of a CFFA member, is eligible to be sponsored by CFFA. The full tuition will be awarded through a random drawing conducted at the June Annual Outing. A FINAL CAST AT THE CORNER POOL





State Buys Land Along the Willimantic

The State of Connecticut recently purchased 885 acres of land on the west bank of the Willimantic River in Tolland. The parcel was purchased for \$1.19 million from Vladimir M. Kollar, who has lived on the property for over 60 years. This is the largest purchase of recreation land the State has made in 5 years. Mr. Kollar will have lifetime use of the house and a small parcel around it.

Our Willi map this month shows the small portion of the parcel (less than 1/6 th of the total) which is in the Trout Management Area. This lies between North River Road (which you take to the abutment pool) and the river, and extends from just above the abutment pool to Roaring Brook. You can now drive on dirt roads right up to the Tarzan Pool on State owned land. The main portion of the land lies on the other side of North River Road, and includes another mile or so of river bank above the T.M.A.

The State guaranteed the preservation of the land as it is now, and will probably improve the trails and install picnic facilities, etc. According to Charles Reed, director of land acquisition and management for the Department of Environmental Progection, the land could be used for hiking, cross-country skiing, picnicing, and of course, fishing. This information came from an article in the Hartford Courant. Mr. Reed sent us a topo map with the parcel marked on it and marked the section within the T.M.A. If anyone would like to see the map of the full parcel, they can send a note to the CFFA P.O. Box and we'll send them a xerox.


