
Subject: "The How and the Why of the Fisherman's Fly"

### JANUARY PROGRAM





LINDA and BOB GOLDER will give a slide presentation entitled "The How and Why of the Fisherman's Fly." The Golders have created a superb show featuring classic, contemporary and collectible <u>trout and salmon flies</u>. It's a look at the best of the beautiful and bizarre flies from private and museum collections, plus an informative discussion of the following topics: Why do people collect fishing flies? What flies are worth collecting? Where can they be found?

Linda and Bob are professional artists who met during studies at Rhode Island School of Design. In addition to managing the Photolab-Graphics Dept. of Marine Biological Laboratory in Woods Hole, Massachusetts, the Golders have been writing and illustrating magazine articles on fly fishing topics for the past five years. Their work has been featured in <a href="Flyfishing">Flyfishing</a>, <a href="Trout">Trout</a>, <a href="Sporting Classics">Sporting Classics</a>, <a href="Massachusetts">Massachusetts</a> Wildlife and <a href="Misoadside">Misoadside</a>: The Flyfishers Forum. Linda's recent work includes full-color photos of salmon flies to accompany an article by Lee Wulff in <a href="Trout">Trout</a>. Bob has just completed two sets of drawings for Trout Unlimited's Atlantic Salmon Task Force.

The drawings teach the viewer how to distinguish small brown trout from salmon parr, and how to identify adult salmon and various trout species. They will be incorporated into signs posted along New England rivers where Atlantic salmon are being reintroduced.

Linda and Bob Golder both serve on the board of directors of the Cape Cod Chapter of Trout Unlimited, which has just won the 1988 Gold Trout Chapter Award for Conservation. This is the highest honor that T.U. National can bestow on a chapter. The Golders have both been active in the chapter's environmental restoration of the Quashnet River, the Massachusetts Acid Rain Monitoring Project, production of the T.U.-sponsored Angler's Guide to Trout Fishing in Massachusetts, and Cape Cod T.U.'s Fly Fishing Course and Fly Tying Course.







I can appreciate the diverse and independent lot that fly fisherman are, however, only active support and participation by CFFA members will insure the future and preservation of all this organization has done to promote and preserve conservation of cold water resources, and the sport of fly fishing in Connecticut. I know I am probably "preaching to the choir."


A military career and present duty in West Berlin, Germany, separate me from home. I think wistfully of fly fishing the "Willi" and the Housatonic River Now I hear the Farmington River even has a "Fly Fishing ONLY" stretch of water. Angling these waters is something many of you enjoy almost year round.


Here in Europe, fly fishing is a privilege of the wealthy, or of members of long established angling clubs. It is not something taken for granted. Stringent laws, expense, travel and time, restrict individual participation. Access to rivers or lakes supporting salmonoid populations is tightly controlled by land owners. Limited resources, and pollution further limit where and when you may fish. "Catch and release" is a concept very new to Europe, and not widely practiced. Believe me when I say that even in populous, industrial Connecticut, there is fly fishing sport and trout that many of our European counterparts would envy.

I guess I just wish that the membership will stand by a fine organization that we may be proud to be a part of, and work together for the future of the sport and the environment.
