## "From the Vest of the President"

Now that all the streams are open, how are you doing? I hope you did better opening day than I did. I felt no pressure to begin fishing early so I made a leisurely jaunt to the Willi at ten. To my surprise virtually no one was there. I began above the island near the west bound rest area and worked my way down to the lower highway pool in the next four hours. It is a good thing no one was there (actually I encountered seven others) because I looked and felt like a beginner. My hooking ratio was very heavily weighted to trees over fish. My one conquest was an 11 inch brown caught on a gold ribbed hare's ear fished dead drift with a strike indicator. I am working to improve my nymphing technique this year. There seems to be a plethora of "how to" information now available on this subject.

I fished the "Willi" four more times the following week with less than bragging results. The water was high during this time but gradually receded while the water tempature was rising to a high of 58 degrees. The Hendrickson hatch seemed to be improving but few fish were rising. Why was the fishing so slow? I have my own nonscientific theory — a northwest wind. I cannot recollect any successful stream fishing under this condition. How about you? Have you had similar experiences? I will try to include the direction of the wind in my diary from now on. I managed 3 on a Hare's Ear Monday, none Tuesday, two on a pheasant tail Wednesday and one on a Hendrickson dry Friday.

The days were sunny and the conversations pleasant so it was all worthwhile. Wednesday I took two you boys, members of my fly fishing club, to Mt. Hope and the Willimantic. Rob, who had never been fly fishing, caught a nice brookie on the first fly he ever tied. Included in his rookie success, however, was his baptism in "the wet waders rlub". I hope your fishing has been as much fun but more fish-filled.

Where are the flies? I still have only 20 of the 100 dozen I need. Come on it's not too much to ask. It is something YOU can do for your club. Mark Phillippe has taken over the Program Committee and is looking for a few people to help. 
Make sure you contact Bruce Cole if you're interested in the Pulaski trip this fall and the outing on the Farmington River June 3.




