
# Directions to the Brewer House

From I-84: Take Route 2 East to Exit 5C (Maple St.). At end of ramp (light), go right on Maple St. At next light (very short distance) go right on Main St. Proceed 3/10 mile to Brewer House/Hockanum Library. As you pass a long lighted storefront on your right ("chiropractor; Fantastic Sam's, etc.) look immediately on your left for two brick buildings. There is a sign "East Hartford Public Library Hockanum Branch." Pull into the driveway and park. The library is on the left, the Brewer House is on the right.

From Glastonbury: Proceed west on Route 2 to Exit 5C. Turn left at the end of the ramp, onto Maple St., and then right on Main Street. Proceed as above.

On Main Street from Glastonbury: Follow Main St. into East Hartford and watch for Maple St. (light) which enters from the right. Look for Brewer House 3/10 mile ahead on the left.

On Main St. from East Hartford: Follow Main St. toward Glastonbury. Remember that Main Street divides here at highway. After going under Route 2, take first left, them bear right onto Main St. There is a Sunoco station on corner just before the Hockanum Library and Brewer House.

# PALMERS, HACKLES AND OTHER STRANGE NOTIONS

In honor of our speaker this month at the Annual CFFA Banquet, I thought it would be a good idea to list a few flies that Paul Kukonen has stated as his favorites. Three flies have been mentioned by Paul with which he has had good results, the Cardinelle, the Mascoma and Maynard's Marvel. The patterns for the Cardinelle and the Mascoma can be found in Joseph Bates, Jr.'s book Streamers & Bucktails - The Big Fish Flies. The pattern for Maynard's Marvel was provided a few years ago by Gene Miller, a CFFA member.

# Cardinelle (as dressed by Paul Kukonen)

This fly was originated by Paul and Bill Chiba. It is recommended for fresh and saltwater, especially landlocks and smallmouth bass. There should be no doubt that this fly can be seen. I wonder how it would do against steelheads?

Hook: Size 2/0 to 12, 4% or 5% long, Limerick

Head: Fluorescent orange thread

Body: Red or orange fluorescent wool or yarn

Ribbing: Optional flat or oval gold

Underwing: Small bunch of bright orange nylon hair, a bit longer than

the hook

Overwing: Large bunch of fluorescent red marabou to make a high wing

extending slightly beyond the hook

Throat: Yellow hackle wound as a collar

# Mascoma Streamer (as tied by Paul Kukonen)

This was originally a salmon fly which was adopted for trout streams. It is effective in clear water with the bronze mallard wing and in discolored water with the mallard or teal wing.

Hook: Size 4 to 10, 4X long

Head: Black thread

Tail: Very small golden pheasant crest feather, curved upward Body: 2 or 3 layers of flat gold tinsel (to build up the body)

Ribbing: Oval gold tinsel

Throat: Very small bunch of orange hackle fibers, 1/2 hook length Wing: About 7 hairs each of yellow, blue and red polar bear or bucktail, can be mixed. Over each side a section of mallard, teal or bronze mallard wing with the tips upward. All slightly longer than the hook.

# Maynard's Marvel

Thread: Black

Tail: Red hackle barbules or red wool

Body: Embossed silver tinsel

Wing: Golden pheasant crest feathers curving down, over which is a

small amount of light blue calftail Topping: Mallard flank feather tied flat Throat: Red hackle barbules, beard style

Although no hook is described, I would suggest a 4X long, size 4 to 10.

### TIPS

-Hooks

A 4X long hook can be a Mustad 79580, Kamasan B-800, Eagle Claw 281, Tiemco TMC 300 or VMC 9283. The Eagle Claw is a 1X heavy hook which could help if you want to get a bit deeper than usual.

I haven't been able to identify a 4X or 5X long, Limerick hook, though I'm sure there is one out there somewhere. I would substitute this hook with a Mustad 79580, or equivalent as stated previously. This hook is the same except it has a round instead of a Limerick bend.

### -Marabou Techniques

Before you position and tie in marabou there is a technique that can be used to make the marabou more manageable for sizing to length and tying in. I simply moisten the marabou. This controls the unruly marabou fibers such that you can accurately set the length as well as reducing the bulk of the fibers to facilitate tying down the feather onto the hook.

### -Tinsel Reinforcement

One method to reinforce your tinsel bodies is to wrap the tinsel ribbing over the body in the opposite direction as you wrapped the tinsel body. To further strengthen the tinsel you can coat the tinsel body with head cement or clear fingernail polish. I prefer the latter since the built-in brush is very handy to apply the polish.
