


## CFFA 21st Annual Banquet February 2, 1991

## Fishing Books for Winter Reading

"The Complete Schwiebert" by Ernest Schwiebert, Dutton, 404 pages.

"Fly Fishing" by Stephen Windsor, Chartwell Books, 127 pages.

"The Illustrated Salar The Salmon" by Henry Williamson, Godine, 207 pages.

Recently, while driving the northern stretches of the Farmington River, I was treated to the sight of several fly-fishermen plying their trade deep in the river. The grace of this type of fishing once again struck me, quickened my own sense of urgency to join them, for I too am a fly-fisherman.

What has this to do with books? Generally, the fisherman's calendar begins to look bleak towards this time of year - our sport generally winding down with Spring seeming far-off. We busy ourselves with fly tying, tackle maintenance and dreams of future trips.

And - we read about fly fishing. My sources for materials are almost unlimited, because as a librarian, the world of books is readily available to me and for the public as well.

To begin my winter's reading, three new books recently arrived relating to my sport - a treasury of trout fishing from around the world. "The Complete Schwiebert" by Ernest Schwiebert, "Fly Fishing" by Stephen Windsor, "The Illustrated Salar The Salmon" by Henry Williamson.

"The Complete Schwiebert" brings together some 25 years of fishing experiences and reflects a compendium of trout lore and fishing in the United States and abroad. Divided into three major sections, each chapter has an introductory annotation with more information for the reader.

Beginning with "Great Water," we experience the varied fishing found in the U.S.; the challenge of the Catskills and Pennsylvania waters to the great, western rivers.

Section two, "A Hatch to Match," discusses the essence of fly fishing, the insects and their imitations, a subject endlessly discussed by fly fishermen.

In the third section, "Edges and Eddies," the strategies, tactics and appropriate tackle receive the usual, thoughtful treatment that readers of Schwiebert have come to expect.

The second book, "Fly Fishing" by Stephen Windsor is not a huge book but it contains wonderful color photos, drawings and describes tackle, fly patterns and rivers not usually seen by most fishermen. Neatly organized, from tackle basics to fly tying any fly fisherman will take a close look at the great amount of information so thoughtfully presented.

One caution, however, this book primarily looks at Great Britain and Europe, so have your passport in good order.

Lastly, for the winter's reading list, I highly recommend "The Illustrated Salar The Salmon" by Henry Williamson. Written in 1935, this a wonderful, imaginative and moving story about the life cycle of Atlantic Salmon.

Williamson truly understood the salmon and put into words that which we generally find ourselves unable to express. It is a classic, reissued with fine illustrations and of interest to may readers who sense their relationship to the beauty of nature through fishing.


