

We also learned that there will be no fall stocking of the Willi as we had expected. This will be a disappointment to many members, especially after the hot summer and spring fish kill. Unfortunately, the rearing pool repairs did not get done in time to get the fish. Kurt took responsibility for this at the October meeting, but it is not right for him or anyone else to feel he caused the problem. We are a volunteer organization, and family and work come first. If anyone is responsible, it is myself, because, as President, I should have looked for more help or at least known that the fish couldn't go in a lot sooner. I let this slip by me, and for that I apologize to all of you.

The lesson from this is that although we are a strong and active organization, we are spread very thin in many areas. Much of what we take for granted each year is, in fact, the work of one individual or a small group of members. We have experienced quite a few changes during the past few years due to changes in peoples lives and the bad economy, and have not yet filled all of the vacancies. One key position, banquet chairman, has essentially been filled by the board for years.

We need to make some changes, and one of the first steps will be to restore the energy, enthusiasm, and active participation in our conservation efforts that was present when I joined CFFA in the late 1970's. 



ESOX LUCIUS

"I was stripping the line and it just stopped!" I shouted to Ernie, "I thought I was hung up on a log."


"You are," Ernie said, "it's four feet long and it's headed that way," pointing out to the center of the lake. Ernie was reeling up as fast as he could. Dave, our guide, was already starting the motor on our 18 foot Lund. The northern pike was doing a quality control check on my reel that Marrayt would love to hear about, and I was wishing I hadn't put off that pee break.

Ever since I was a young fisherman, reading fishing adventures in Field and Stream, and Outdoor Life, I wanted to go to the Northwest Territories and fish for monster pike. When Ernie and I stopped at Ken Gangler's booth at the Worcester Sportsman's Show, Ken didn't have to twist our arms to get us to make a reservation. Ken is the owner and operator of Scott Lake Lodge on the borders of Saskatchewan and Northwest Territories. We signed up for a week in June and spent the next few months planning the demise of Esox Lucius.

When June finally arrived we were ready. We had tied practically every fly known to man and some that were so special that we put Master locks on our fly boxes. These we were sure would revolutionize pike fishing. It didn't quite work out the way we expected. The Master locks stayed on and two old standbys, the Mickey Finn and the Seaducer, were hatching all week. Luckily, we had tied a good number of these in 1/0 and 3/0 sizes four to six inches long. For those of you that may not know Ernie, a good number is about 200. In fact at one point I was wondering if the Northwest 757 was going to have to tow a U-Haul just for flies. Traveling with all those flies was an adventure in itself. Ernie set off every airport alarm between here and Winnipeg. He even had to calm down an airport employee after she opened his carry on and found all those feathery creations.

Getting to Scott Lake from Connecticut takes about a day and a half. You spend one night in Winnipeg, then early the next morning board a jet chartered by the lodge. Two stops, a van ride, and a lift on a float plane gets you to the 40 square mile lake about noon. We unpacked, had lunch, and were on the lake in about 30 minutes - a lodge record, according to our guide.

The huge pike took us out of the shallow bay into the open water. He went to the bottom and just lay there. Dave eased the boat toward the motionless pike, helping me retrieve some line. When the fly line reached the reel, he cut the motor. It was a stalemate. The pike refusing to move. My seven weight strained to its limit. "He's starting to come up," I yelled. The pike shot to the surface, rolled, and smacked the water with his huge tail filling the air with spray. He started for the bottom again. I leaned on the rod, putting more pressure on the unwieldy fish. He couldn't make it this time and started to come up, angling towards the boat. "I think we can land him Dave," I said. The exhausted fish surfaced next to the boat and rolled on its side. Dave slipped the "Release Cradle" under the fish and quickly closed it. We weighed the monster pike and instantly released the 26 lb northern. That was the fourth pike over 20 lbs we caught that day. We tipped our hats to Scott Lake and headed for the lodge.




