
FEBRUARY MEETING

President's Message

Over the past 25 years, CFFA has grown from a handful of charter members to an organization of more than 300 members dedicated to preserving and promoting the pleasures and traditions of fly fishing and conserving game fish waters. In addition to their monthly meetings and programs, CFFA members have been involved in many projects including annual fly tying, fly fishing and rod building schools, trout stocking and trail maintenance in the Willimantic River Trout Management Area, and other cooperative efforts with DEP and other organizations to develop and sustain a quality fishery in Connecticut.

CFFA members were also involved in major stream improvements along Jeremy's River, the relocation of parts of the Yantic River and Roaring Brook due to nearby highway construction and the establishment of a fly fishing only area, and ultimately, a trout management area on the Willimantic

Introduction - (Excerpt) - by Ken Parkany

This book will help you catch fish. Whether you are a beginner or an experienced flyfisher, this book will also help you improve your skills. In an overall sense its obvious purpose is to educate.

The Flyfisher's Companion is the first single source of educational flyfishing information on Connecticut fly patterns and fly fishing published. It contains some of the best articles from the Connecticut Fly Fishermen's Association's newsletter Lines & Leaders, written over a span of twenty-five years. The "authors" are ordinary anglers who made an original or unique discovery or observation and chose to share it. Or they were, perhaps, helped by someone else in their flyfishing education and then inspired to share that knowledge for the benefit of others.

This book represents the highlights of 25 years of newsletter publication by CFFA members, more than a generation of effort and activity, featuring Connecticut-developed fly patterns and information on Connecticut rivers and streams. Some of the information it contains may be dated, much of it is timeless. I think you will find all of it interesting and entertaining. Enjoy a trip through our past, take and apply what you will, and contribute something yourself to the next generation.
