

There is more than fishing on a fishing trip. There is Mother Nature in all her glory. There is the excitement that builds up gradually as **□ □ □** take off from Bradley approaches. I have been

on many fishing trips and never got over this feeling. It starts with researching the area you will fish, the equipment and flies to use, etc.

What a pleasure when you board a float plane on the final leg of your journey. You forget the nine hours in a jet. I love flying in a float plane, no nicer sound than a piston engine roaring and a prop spinning. This is flying. The float plane flies at 1,000 feet, so you can view the scenery, and no finer scenery than flying over the Alaskan Tundra and you often see moose browsing. You know it's not a dream when your plane lets down on your home river and you are only a ten minute boat ride from camp. Sometimes a bonus awaits you. Last year as we got off the plane, an apparition appeared on shore. It was a beautiful woman waiting to take the plane to Anchorage! We later learned that she was a famous model. It is lucky that no one fell in the river as all eyes were not on the flimsy steps as we deplaned.

A quick boat trip to the camp. A quick snack and to our cabin to set up our fishing gear, clothes flying all over the place to be put away later. We are at peak tension now as we are only minutes away from our first cast to Pacific Salmon. One foot out of the boat and already stripping out line. Generally we are so anxious to fish that we forget to remove our life jackets. It's a

wonderful feeling to breath in clean air. Back to camp at 6:00 to clean up and then a cold beer at the lodge.

Now we finally relax, meet the other fishermen and discuss fishing. Next is a gourmet meal - the menu reads like one from the finest restaurant. Although our day starts at 4:30am and ends at 6:00pm, with these hours spent wading, the average weight gain is five to ten pounds in ten days!

Who won't stop fishing to view the sunrise highlighted by snow covered mountains or enjoy the haunting cry of a loon. Eagles are often your companions while motoring up the river. The eerie feeling that you get as you step ashore and see fresh bear tracks all along the shore. While fishing you observe the king salmon in the 25-50 pound class fighting their way through 6 inches of water to get to their spawning grounds, only to die after spawning and then to feed bears and rainbow trout. 
P.S. Charlie was at least a foot down in the clay!



Original Patterns from the Bench of Paul Beaudreau

Scrap Fly

Hook: #16 Wet Fly

Thread: Black

Tail: Aftershaft From Pheasant, Partridge, or

Grouse

Body: Peacock Herl

Rib: Grizzly Hackle #14 or #16

- Tie the aftershaft on rear of hook keeping it flat with the concave side pointed down. The length should be about 3 to 4 hook lengths past the bend of the hook.
- Next secure 3 or 4 peacock herl fibers to rear 3/4 of the hook shank and right up to the butt of the aftershaft feather. This will form a smooth underbody for the herl when wrapped.
- Tie in a grizzly hackle securing the butt end to hook about 1/8" from rear of shank.
- Bring the thread back to the peacock butts and start wrapping the herl around the tying thread clockwise, six turns are plenty.
- Now start wrapping the herl and tying thread together around the shank making more wraps around the thread with each wrap around the shank.
 Two turns of the herl noodle around the shank will bring you up to the hackle butt.
- Continue wrapping to 1/16" behind eye of hook and tie off herl.
- Bring grizzly forward in a slightly open spiral to end of peacock herl. Tie off. Form a small head.

This fly works well in large slow moving pools in rivers and great in ponds and lakes fished with erratic 4 inch strips. About 15 years ago when I first started tying and fishing this fly, the aftershaft was considered scrap by most of us. Now they have become popular for emerger and pupa wings, gills on various nymphs, nymph bodies, leech bodies and trailing shucks.

suggested that students bring materials to take notes.


