

### Albacore Fever - The Sequel

Salt water fishermen wait all year for the Albacore to show up. This year, Jerry Wade and I decided to bring his trailer down a couple weeks early to avoid the high winds and cold that show up in October. We set up the trailer, went grocery shopping, and visited friends. Although we would have only about 2 ½ hours of evening fishing, we motored

out to the reef. When we got there, all hell broke loose. Albacore were breaking everywhere. Very hungry fish as we were hooking up at almost every cast. The guides told us that it was the first time that they showed up in the Sound.

The next morning, with only a coffee, back to the reef. Ditto. Fish everywhere and again fish on constantly. Only two other boats, as the word had not got out yet. It was so hot that we went in during the day; but back at the reef in the evening. Same as before, fish everywhere and smashing our fly. We used a modified White Deceiver that I tie.

The word finally got around and next morning, counted 22 boats and all hooking up. The Deceiver worked for two days. We then changed to Jerry Wade's Copper Top, which we used until the end of the week. Page Rogers fished with us on the third day and boated 19 fish on her fly pattern. We had five doubles this day. We fished only about six hours a day, and Jerry and I boated 70 Albacore plus or minus. At times, they came so fast that we quit counting after we got to 40. More Albacore in this week than in a lifetime. Sometimes the fishing god smiles on you.

One day the tide was dead low at 5:00pm, and the ocean was as smooth as glass, the worst of conditions. But, we decided to go out and cruise around instead of hanging round the trailer. No birds and the ocean looked bare of fish; but we boated 10 Albacore. The weather god also smiled on us, as each day it was calm and we fished in tee-shirts. (The following week, as I write this, the temperature has not got out of the 60's!). A trip to remember!





#### Age, Length & Weight of Bluefish


