



The Great White by Jack Smola



The White River is located in northern Arkansas on the Missouri border. The White is a tailwater fishery with the

Norfolk as a tributary. Bass country...Wrong...one million plus trout stocked a year!

I first started fishing the trout rivers of Arkansas (after I found where Arkansas was located) two years ago. My friend, Scott, moved his company to Oklahoma and called me to tell me about a great trout fishery he had found. The call was made with his cellular phone while playing a four pound Rainbow.

I was on a plane in late October for the spawning Browns, five to forty pounds. I landed in Little Rock with Scott waiting with a coffee. We loaded his truck and headed for the Little Red for three hours of fishing before dark.

The terrain in Arkansas is similar to New Hampshire with its rolling hills and small towns. We arrived on the Little Red at Heber Springs Trophy area. It was crowded in the lower area but we moved around the bend and the fishing was all ours. I heard splashing on the river, Beaver, I thought. No!!! It was a porpoising Brown. Holy Cow!!! I caught six fish, 14 to 16 inches, not pounds. There is always tomorrow.

We left Heber Springs that night for the Best Western in Mountain Home and hit the sack. Mountain Home is situated between the White and Norfolk Rivers. Up at 5 a.m., we then drove for a half hour to the White. The river starts at the base of Bull Shoals Dam. The Dam is about 1/8 mile long with eight turbine generating gates with under-dam release which insures fifty degree water all year long. The water was down to one gate which produces about two to four foot deep chutes in the river which in turn pools up the fish. The river is easy wading with a cinder bottom. This is Woolly Bugger water, sinking tip lines and seven weight rods. It was a ten Rainbow morning. We saw huge Browns on their spawning beds. No fly interested them! It still turned out to be a thirty fish day.

The next morning the water was up on the White so the Norfolk River was the ticket. We used the handicapped access area and began to wade upstream to two small islands and the riffle above. I looked at my feet and saw a ball of fish. Rainbows, Browns and Cutthroats who were feeding on nymphs that I kicked up as I walked. Landed ten to fifteen fish here.

Driving to McCellan's Trout Dock, we paid two dollars each to park. It was well worth the price and then some. McCellan will come and pick you up by boat if you get Continued on page 6

trapped in high water. The flies of the day were Black Woolly Buggers with a Sow Bug as a dropper. I landed forty Trout with the biggest three pounds, maybe, I always guess small.

Right!!!!!!!

The people of the area are outgoing and friendly. They would stop and talk all day. Their lifestyle is half speed compared to New Englanders. The food in the South is fried or fried, but good.

The next day we arrived back at Bull Shovels. There were plenty of fish and the weather was great with temperatures from the mid fifties to low sixties. Each day seemed to get better and better.


The last day came too quickly. We were up and on the river by 6:30 at Brainard's Bend on the White. The area had a boat shuttle service on the three miles of catch and release fly fishing only. The middle section was a large pool, an 1/8th of a mile long with a pod of thirty to fifty fish which made the dock area their home. We decided not to fish for them, rather headed down stream by boat to fish both sides of a small island, using a Glow Bug as dropper and a Black Woolly Bugger. I started with four dozen Woolly Buggers and now was down to one and a half. It was a slow morning with five to six fish. I switched to an Olive Bugger...look out, it's Big...get the camera. The first thing you do after hooking your big fish is to look around to see who is watching. No jumper

here, rather head shakes and runs. It measured twentythree inches and six and a half pounds of Cut/bow. I yelled for the camera and released him.

After a half hour gloating, we headed upstream to the beginning of the pool. Scott went into the riffle and I went into the tail of the Keep area. Twenty fish in two hours which included several attempts at a ten pounder porpoising on the far bank.

At the end of the day we headed back to motel and a big steak. The last day made the trip! I left scratch marks on the tree where they had to pry me off to go home.


I am going back the end of March, 1997, for spawning Rainbows. Come see my slides and join me next October.
