Winter Fly Fishing

The warmth of summer and early fall has gone. The bare trees and the crisp morning air usually indicate that it's time to put away the fly rod until spring. Don't! Trout may still be taken on a fly if you

alter your fishing technique to match the conditions. The water is colder which means slow down the retrieve. Fish the deep pockets and edges of runs in areas that held fish all summer.

Use the same nymphs you used in the summer but drop down a size or two. It's amazing how a small fly fished slow will turn on a fish's attack mode or hunger switch.

I was on the Deerfield last week in 40 degree water and saw the white of a trout's mouth, a little flash and a movement in front of me. I was fishing a double streamer rig. A few casts brought no attention so I switched to a floating line and a small caddis pupa. Since I'm not a fan of strike indicators I kept the fly line high for a drag free float. On the very first drift my line tightened and a large swirl appeared in front of me. Big fish! I fought and landed a 23 inch rainbow.

I released the fish and cast to my right. I was startled by such a quick hit that my leader snapped off. (Rule #1 - check your rig after a big fish.) This is the type of action available in the early winter.

Fish the heat of the day, 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. A warming of a degree of two will trigger a trout to strike.

The hatches of fall are all gone now. Or are they? Winter brings two flies out of my fly box: one, a size #20 black caddis and the other, a tiny blue winged olive (#24-28).

You and I know it's winter but do the trout? They know something is different. They move slower but they still must eat. If they're not feeding in one pool move to another and try two, three or four spots. They'll be feeding somewhere. I prefer to stand at the edge of the pool because of the winter conditions, standing in the low water and fishing to the deep water. The Ovation pool on the Farmington and Carbis Bend on the Deerfield are two examples of pools that begin in shallow water and drop off dramatically.

Winter fly fishing may call for a few different techniques but the results can be as exciting as a June hatch.


In addition we will have our publication, The Flyfisher's Companion on hand for anyone wishing to obtain a copy.

CFFA 28th Annual Banquet 21st February 1998


