FROM THE VEST OF THE PRESIDENT

It was suggested a few months ago that the CFFA create its own web page. Larry Johnson and I volunteered to look into it and make a recommendation to the board of directors. After looking at what seemed to be hundreds of fly fishing related web sites, Larry and I reported that we did not recommend that the CFFA spend the time or money to create its own web site, for several reasons. If the site is not maintained on an almost daily basis, it could create a negative image of our organization. We found that many sites, including club sites were not kept up, and that some information, such as who the speaker was going to be for a particular meeting, was a few months old. Also, there are virtually hundreds of fly-fishing sites carrying the same information: fly patterns, fishing reports, tips, etc. Why spend the time and money to duplicate what has already been done? It was suggested that our newsletter be put online. Our contention there was that Lines & Leaders is a monthly newsletter (for only nine months of the year). So at the very least, the site would be stagnant for a month at a time. We also felt that our newsletter was a benefit for dues paying members exclusively. There's more, but I'm sure that you get the drift. The issue is not dead. We will revisit it from time to time, but unless we come up with a site that we think is special, and have somebody to keep it fresh, why get in there with hundreds of others that are all basically the same.

We did come up with one other idea. Maybe individual club web sites are not the way to go. Maybe the Connecticut Associations should have a combined site (Fly-Fishing in Connecticut) sell some advertising (banner ads) to defray the costs, and promote fly-fishing in Connecticut in general. Maybe even, have a hosted chat line or a message board. Everybody wins, the clubs, the shops, the fly fishers and Connecticut. The question remains, though. How do you keep it fresh?

ALBACORE By Ernie Boutiette



Every year I fish for one week for false albacore out of Stonington in Jerry Wade's boat. This year two days with Charlie Place, two with Roger Plourde, and two with Page Rogers and of course Jerry Wade, the best guide on the Sound. First, I want to dispel the fallacy that the

experts write about. They claim that an eight or ten pound leader is a must as albies have such good eyesight. I guess that we must have missed their articles as we all use 35# test Orvis super strong and boated about 100 albies in six days and at times had wire on when blues were in the area and still caught albies. We all used intermediate lines, about a 7' leader. The first two days, all were caught on Jerry Wade's Copper Top, a fly he designed about three years ago. The next four days, all were caught on variations of white deceivers that I tie, plus Roger Plourde tied one with slightly different materials on which he caught over 20 albies one afternoon and I caught 9 or 10 the next morning on the same fly. The best thing was we never had to go more than to Watch Hill or Napatree, a 10 or 15 minute boat ride. We

also came in at change of tide for a few hours for lunch and a nap. We would fish for only about seven hours a day. One day we saw a blitz on the rocks at Napatree. We ran in and I put a cast into them and caught a blue; but albie fever was on us and we left them When albie fever strikes, we ignore blues and bass. We had landed quite a few doubles with no problem; but suddenly a school swam by and we had a triple on. The three fish were out at least 200 feet and swimming in every direction. Jerry's fish swam away from mine and Roger's; but Roger's and mine crisscrossed each other and the Chinese fire drill was on. First I would race to the front of the boat and Roger to the back, and then we would reverse. Eventually we got our lines untangled and Roger's fish came to net. Jerry, with an albie on, netted it with one hand. Next Jerry's came to the net. Mine next; but when the fly line came in, it had a knot in it. Roger finally got the knot out and mine was netted. Our first triple! The man who was watching this from a boat near us was in stitches with laughter. Outside of my 310 Sage rod exploding into four pieces, all became normal except for a couple of hookups on lobster buoys. Fishing albies can try both fisherman and equipment. Roger Plourde was top rod this day. The most and biggest — 13# 7 oz. on our digital scale. The biggest albie that I ever saw.

Hints and Tips from Jack Smola

- To repair the leaks in your waders, take them out of your trunk, fill them with water, and mark the leaks. Then turn them inside out, to air them and get the stench of road kill out.
- Remove the contents of your vest and lay them out on the table so you'll remember what's in there. Discard mummified McNuggets.
- ✓ Open up all of your fly boxes and do an inventory. Replace or retie those flies that are missing.
- ✓ In the spring, hang fly paper from a tree near your favorite pool to check what's hatching.



- Replace the laces in your wading boots and your net bag.
- Oil your reels and back off all the drags. Install new batteries in your flash light and silicone the joints of your wading staff.
- Inspect your fly lines for cracks and examine the leader loops. Wash your fly lines in Ivory soap or Woolite and add backing to your reel if necessary.
- Make a wish list of all the things that you need for the coming season.
- ✓ Put a few zip lock bags in your vest for your wallet, camera, etc.
- ✓ Vest "must haves" extra retractor, waterproof disposable camera, mosquito repellant stick (so you don't get it on your flylines) sun block, and folding wading staff.
- If you're over forty, get a flip magnifier and midge fly threader. Don't forget the Polaroid sunglasses, and a hook sharpener.

(These are a few things to do during the 'off' season. Jack guides, builds custom rods and lectures about fly fishing. Ed.)
