## The Long Distance Release (LDR) by Tammy DiGristine

And so another Tam adventure begins....

The good thing about flyfishing in the saltwater, or any method of fishing for that matter, is that you just never know what you are going to catch. Take for instance the catch I made with my friend from CA last weekend.....

Picked up a friend from CA at the airport first thing Thursday morning and we got to the hotel room (2 beds!!) and slept for a while. Then we ate and headed to the water. Took him out to my tarpon hole where all of wondering why my tarpon hasn't my pet tarpon live, hoping to get him hooked up. It was his first time ever seeing a tarpon, and he saw PLENTY of them. I jumped one and missed a bunch more, and he got nada. Zilch. Zero.

Friday morning we went out with my favorite fishin pal (well, one of them anyway) and we showed Josh what tailing redfish were... Eric got a bunch of follows, a few strikes and cussed a lot, Josh got one follow, and I got about a dozen follows, a dozen strikes, snagged one by it's tail (yes, there were THAT many right there), lined about 100 of them, got one on good, jumped another and just about stepped on one. We all caught a bunch of trout that morning.

Friday night it was time to show him what kind of trouble Tam can get into without trying. He had heard all of the Tam stories, and didn't know yet whether to believe them or not but after Friday night, he is a believer.. a firm believer!

Back to the tarpon hole we went, standing on the bank of the canal and

fishing it for poons. I made a cast.. strip, let the fly sink, strip, let the fly sink, strip... all the way back across.. nothing.

Second cast same thing. Finally I made a cast across the entire canal and my fly landed perfectly one inch from the far bank. Strip once, let it sink, strip twice, let it sink, strip 3 times, let it sink... bump... bump bump... perfect strip strike, followed immediately by another. I have gotten SO GOOD at hooksets in tarpon, which is the hardest thing about tarpon fishin'. So I have my hook set firmly and I am jumped yet. They ALWAYS jump at the hookset. Pulled up on my rod to raise it and lo and behold, a 7 foot alligator surfaces with my fly firmly and perfectly set in its tail. Great!

So I sit there and rationalize the situation. The gator is 50 ft. away, 7 ft truck, and a big assed alligator, and long and probably not too happy that there is a #2 Copper Liz implanted in its ass. I'm on the bank, a nice tasty morsel holding the rod to which it is attached. What to do? Break the tippet of course! It's only 8 lb.. no problem! So I yank and jerk and straightline and try everything short of breaking my rod to break the tippet and nothing. This has got to be the strongest 8 lb tippet in the world! No lie . All I succeeded in doing the whole Once the gator was halfway on the time was to pull the gator closer. He made a few good runs, rolled a few times and basically just went along for the ride.

So here I am with 8 lb tippet, dragging a 125+ pound gator backwards towards me. NOT GOOD! When he got within 5 ft of me, I knew I had to do something. I did the only thing I could have done.... I picked up Josh's jaw off the ground, (this was the first time he had ever SEEN a gator) handed him my keys and told him to go get my truck. He went, got it, came back and started to park it. Meanwhile me and the gator are playing give and take with the line. I told Josh not to park the truck, but to pull up next to me on the road and stop. I climbed into the bed of the truck, stood there with my rod pointed at the gator, palmed the reel and told Josh to drive slowly away from there.

He looked at me puzzled and I told him again. He slowly started to drive away, which caused me to really start dragging this reptile from hell. That is when he started to fight.

Now mind you this is a bumpety scrumpety dirt road, an old pick up I'm STANDING in the back of the truck, fighting the alligator and trying to keep my balance all in the name of breaking 8 lb tippet. It should be a whole lot easier than this. Finally he drove far enough and I fought hard enough that we managed to get the sucker to the land and up on the bank, then halfway up the bank. Still my tippet would not break. He was really going off by now.. Josh and the gator. road, he finally thrashed enough and my tippet FINALLY snapped. HOORAY!

#### SORTING YOUR HACKLES

Get a hackle sizing gage and presort your hackles. If you divide them into envelopes as to size, quality and type, wet or dry, you will improve all three aspects of your tying. Small gages that clamp in your vise sell for about \$4.00. After many years of plucking my hackles directly from the neck for use I decided to presort the hackles from several necks. After the sorting, not only did I achieve my objective of more uniform flies; I got a crash course in judging the quality of hackles, necks, and a real appreciation of value received for dollars spent. Not all necks and not all feathers are created equal! Other rewards were reduced tying time and reduced storage space, especially important to those who travel with a tying kit. If you don't gage and sort your hackles, I urge you to try it once. Even if you decide that you would rather leave the feathers on the skin, sorting a few necks will teach you a lot about judging their quality.

By the way, I don't presort saddle hackles because the feathers are generally much more uniform in size and I can often get several flies from a single feather.
