Tam has been an avid fly fisher all her life. She's spent most of her time fishing in Florida, in places like Mosquito Lagoon and Indian River. A recent move to Vancouver Island, Canada has turned her attention to salmon and steelhead. That's not all; sometime in early 2000 she's moving to Costa Rica to work as a fly fishing guide. As you can see Tam has a busy life so this may be our one and only chance to have her as a speaker.

Tam on wading: "Never wet wade in the lagoon after just shaving your legs. If you do make sure there are no small children in the immediate vicinity that might hear the cussing."

Tam on Casting: "The Over The Saw Grass Delivery. This is a move for serious fly rodders that like to fish the canals. It involves doing a quadruple haul. The double haul is self-explanatory, the other two hauls are for getting your fly line untangled from the saw grass."

Tam on setting the hook: "The Running Hook set, shown to me by a friend from Oregon that came to Florida to fish with me. After fishing for a while a five-

foot alligator came out of nowhere and took his fly. The poor guy didn't know whether to set the hook or run like hell. He opted for both. It was quite a good move and he immediately earned my respect."

Tam on getting her first fly-fishing vest: "I found the lipstick pocket right away. But what do I do with the other 109 pockets?"

that those two mediums provided me. I have never known falling like this! It's wonderful. Sometimes I don't even see the ice. I am just walking along minding my own business and WHAM!!! I'm falling. Snow covers all of the little rocks and twigs and holes in the ground well. world's best Fall Girl. It's true. Just ask Somehow I manage to still find them all.

> I can be trudging through the snow with all of my fishing gear and usually commenting to myself about how I should be falling right about now. Next thing I know, I'm ass over elbows and falling. It never fails me.

Another opportunity for falling presented itself to me here as well. The salmon runs are great for falling! Not only in the water, but out of the water as well. In the water when I am standing there minding my own business, fishing away, drifting a fly across and down the streams, the salmon will come up and bump my legs, or dead ones will come down and bump against them. Years of wading in the lagoon around the alligators have my nerves honed to a sharpness that the knife manufacturers of Happy Holidays! the world are envious of. One of them bumps into my legs and WHAM! I'm jumping, and before I know it, I'm falling again.

On the land, where they end up after they are dead, they are very useful for falling purposes as well. I don't know how they get up into trees and on trails 20 feet from the water but they do. I could be walking along just fine and suddenly look up and see a half decayed salmon carcass staring me in the face from a tree limb. WHAM! I'm freaking out and falling. Better yet, I can be walking along the trails, step over a giant log, place my foot securely down on the slimy carcass of a dead salmon and no sooner than I pick my other foot up than I am falling again. It's amazing.

I think perhaps I may very well be one of the best Fall Girls that ever walked the face of the earth. I don't even wave my arms anymore, I just sort of gooooo with



it. It's amazing to watch. My fishing partners rarely say anything about it anymore. I don't get inquiries as to whether I am all right or not anymore, just a simple barely visible glance, a number rating and then back to normal, as if nothing ever happened. That my friends, is the true sign of a Fall Girl if ever I knew one.

With me now being in Canada, and away from the good old US of A, I can now claim to be an International Fall Girl. What joy that brings me! People write me and ask for advice on falling. They ask how it is that I have never been severely maimed or hurt with my vast experiences in falling. I do not know. I guess I'm just good at it. People also write me and ask questions related to casting. I tell them all the same thing; if you want to learn about casting, learn to fall. No, it won't help with your double haul or your steeple cast, but it will surely teach you about plaster casts, and temporary casts and soft casts.

I started my career as a professional Fall Girl down there in Florida. Having lived there 21 years, I would almost go so far as to say that I mastered the art of falling in Florida. I fell in every possible way there was to fall, especially if there was fishing involved. A true fall person does their best falls while fishing. Fishing and falling seem to go hand in hand.

I am sure you have all heard of the term

"fall guy". Well, I'm here to tell you all

about it. I'm not a guy, of that there is

no doubt, but this could be to my

advantage in the ways of being a "fall

guy", after all, girls tend to have more

padding than guys. You see, I'm the

anyone that I have ever fished with.

In Florida, I managed to fall into the water, out of the water, getting into the water, walking to the water, walking away from the water, while casting, while fighting fish, while standing still. I fell out of trees, out of boats, out of cars, trucks and even purposely fell out of airplanes several times. After all, if you are going to be good at falling, you should learn to fall thousands of feet.

Then I started traveling to fish. The world was mine. I could be a National Fall Girl. I did well with it. I fell in water and on trails and in woods and on land in several states. I fell in Maryland, Connecticut, West Virginia, Pennsylvania, North Carolina, Georgia, Arizona, Nevada and even in Tennessee. I was destined to be a Fall Girl. I was so good at it! The north allowed me the pleasure of learning about falling down mountains, off of cliffs and into cold water. It taught me how to fall in moving water, on trout streams, in ponds, lakes and small rivers. I fell in creeks. I fell in flyshops. I did it all.

The one thing I was lacking experience in was something I found when I moved here, to Vancouver Island. It was here that I learned the true value of snow and ice. Oh, the many opportunities to fall





DIRECTIONS FOR JANUARY 2000 MEETING

Our January meeting will be held in the East Hartford Middle School on Burnside Ave. (for some members this is the former East Hartford High). We will be meeting in the school cafeteria.

FROM HARTFORD ON I-84

Take the Roberts Street Exit and take the left hand ramp. At the light, go left, across the highway, past the Holiday Inn, all the way to Forbes Street. Go left onto Forbes St., which becomes Scotland Rd. Go all the way to Burnside Ave. Turn right at the light onto Burnside. The middle school will be on the right, just up the road. There are two entrances, so if you miss the first, take the second. Part and go to the Auditorium entrance, which is on your left as you face the building. Go inside, past the auditorium, and turn left into the cafeteria.

FROM MANCHESTER/VERNON ON I-84
