

waters throughout the state. Among the areas to be stocked this fall are twenty-three lakes and ponds, fourteen rivers and streams that include twelve of the Trout Management Areas, and eight Trout Parks. Additional fishing related information, including broodstock salmon stockings which begin this month, can be found on the DEEP Fisheries web pages at www.ct.gov/deep/fishing and on the Fisheries and Wildlife Facebook page.

Freshwater bass become more active as the water cools back into the 60's and will attack fast moving streamers, crayfish patterns fished deep and top water frog imitations. Some bass will be shallow and others still deep, so try tapering shorelines with deepwater access. As the water cools further, slow down your presentation and downsize your flies.


On the salty side of things, I've caught more and bigger striped bass during the daylight in Our waters are less October than in any Small other month. flies do an excellent job of imitating sand eels and silversides which are currently migrating out of inlets and into the waiting mouths of bass. Larger, fullerbodied baits like bunker Menhaden), (Atlantic shad and mullet are also near the top of a striper's menu this time of year. False albacore and bonito, which are members of the tuna family, are visiting our inshore waters and they often focus on the smaller baitfish. especially anchovies. The bluefish are more ravenous than ever. Bright, flashy streamers and surface poppers seem to attract blues, but they are not picky eaters and will usually strike anything remotely resembling any type of prey. Bluefish and bonito have lots of sharp teeth so bring bite tippet to prevent your flies from being bitten off and bring long-nosed pliers and a boga grip to protect yourself when unhooking them.

I love October days because they can warm, with dry air, colorful foliage and no biting bugs. With only still be home for dinner. doing. crowded because many sportsmen are focused on
