A highly renowned guide, fly tier and author specializing in fishing for trout and steelhead, Eric Stroup is helping to revolutionize the way we learn about fly fishing with his videos and his website *Face Time Fly Fishing*. You can meet him at our Expo and see firsthand his flies and fishing tactics. The Expo (admission \$1) is Saturday February 1<sup>st</sup> at Maneeley's in South Windsor from 9:00 am till 3:00 pm. It also features dozens of exhibitors and vendors along with free technical seminars and a tag sale full of bargains. It's the best little fly fishing show around.

A short presentation ceremony will occur during this year's Expo at 11:00 am when CFFA will donate 20 Regal vises and assorted fly tying tools to three unique local schools: The Learning Clinic in Brooklyn, CT where young people experience custom tailored educational and recreational opportunities, The Sound School Regional Vocational Aquaculture Center in New Haven which prepares high school students for careers in the marine sciences, and CFFA's own Beginner Fly Tying School where people of all ages learn to tie a dozen different flies over the course of six classroom sessions. All three of these groups will utilize the donated items in their respective curriculums for many years to come. We wish to thank Regal Engineering, Nick Masi Enterprises and Jeff Becker for their generous help to CFFA in making these donations possible.

CFFA's annual Banquet also occurs at Maneeley's starting at 6:00 pm on February 1<sup>st</sup>. Eric Stroup will present a program of interest to everyone, whether they fish or not. Our famous bucket raffles will have a

new format at the Banquet and are expected to be better than ever. Space is filling-up, so reserve your place today by using the Banquet dinner form included with this newsletter. There will not be another newsletter before this big day, so mark your calendars for the first Saturday in February – that's the day before the Super Bowl. Don't forget, there is no monthly meeting in February because of the Expo & Banquet. Our recent Expos and Banquets have been very well attended, have received rave reviews and have been quite successful for the club. This is the single most important day of the year for CFFA, so if you can, please offer to assist our co-chairmen Kurt Jagielow and Roger Plourde.


