"When you are fishing, you must be able to move fluidly through multiple approaches and not be dogmatic in your thinking. There really is no one best way."



A highly renowned competition fly fisher, instructor and author specializing in fishing for trout, George Daniel is our Special Guest at the upcoming Expo and Banquet. As a teenager in Pennsylvania he was tutored by the legendary Joe Humphreys. George went on to win a Fly Fishing Masters and two U.S. National Championships. His recent book, Dynamic Nymphing is probably the most thorough study ever published on catching trout with nymphs. You can meet him at our Expo and see firsthand his flies and fishing tactics. George will present one of the free technical seminars at the Expo, and he'll be available throughout the day on the Expo floor. The Expo (admission \$3) is Saturday February 7th at Maneeley's in South Windsor from 9:00 am till 3:00 pm. It also features dozens of exhibitors and vendors along with a tag sale full of bargains. It's the best little fly fishing show around.

CFFA's annual Banquet also occurs that day at Maneeley's starting at 6:00 pm. After dinner George Daniel will present a program of interest to everyone, whether they fish or not, and our famous bucket raffles are expected to be better than ever this year. Space is filling-up, so reserve your place today by using the Banquet Dinner Reservation Form included with this newsletter. There will not be another newsletter before this big day, so mark your calendars for the first Saturday in February – that's the weekend after the Super Bowl this year. Don't forget, there is no monthly meeting in February because of the Expo & Banquet. At this point there are also no board meetings scheduled for January or February.

Our recent Expos and Banquets have received rave reviews and have been quite successful for the club. Last year's Expo smashed attendance records with 291 attendees plus 60 workers. This is the single most important day of the year for CFFA, so if you can, please offer to assist our cochairmen Kurt Jagielow and Roger Plourde. They especially need help at 3:00pm with transforming the Expo hall into the Banquet dining room. Another way you can help is to donate an item or service for the bucket raffles or the tag sale. The January monthly meeting on Wednesday the 14th at the Clubhouse is Pizza & a Movie Night so be sure to bring your appetite. CFFA's Fly Tying Classes begin on January 8th and will run for six consecutive Thursdays, 7:00pm at Cabela's conference room near their deli. If you are a beginner fly tyer, or just a rusty one, this is a great opportunity to learn from some of our very best instructors. Two of the sessions will be taught by professional fly tyer Mike Stewart, one by professional tyer Leslie Wrixon, two by our past Education Chairman for 22 years Gary Steinmiller, and one by myself. Tuition for the entire course is only \$30 for kids (and one parent can accompany them for free), \$40 for adult CFFA members and \$50 for everyone else. All tools and materials are provided, but students can use their own equipment if they have some. Just bring glasses or magnifiers if your vision needs assistance. Space is limited so register now by phoning Education Chairman Richard Gilligan at 860-839-2070.

Upon completion of this upcoming Tying Course, Richard is retiring as Education Chair. On behalf of our entire club, I want to thank him for all his work in keeping this important CFFA program not only alive, but vibrant and growing too. We are very much in need of someone to fill this critical position. Now is the perfect time for someone new to ease into the role because they can work side-by-side with Richard during this Tying Course that begins January 8th. It is doubtful that we can have future Fly Fishing or Tying Courses until someone steps-up. Note that this position does not require teaching any classes, and it certainly does not require any expertise in the subject matters. It

mostly involves administrative functions like registering the students and coordinating the teachers and organizing the classroom materials.

CFFA has completed another very good year and I want to thank our dedicated board of directors for making that happen. I also want to send a big thanks to all of you, the CFFA club members, for supporting our club with your time, talent and resources. Our club has the most awesome members! All the various club events in the past year were well attended, and the folks that participated enjoyed the comradery. A lot of fun was had along the way and some nice fish were landed too. We did our part to preserve and promote the pleasures and traditions of fly fishing and to conserve game fish waters.

Our Banquet and Expo Speaker for February 7th will be George Daniel

George Daniel began fly fishing at age 6 while growing up in Potter County, PA. Growing up along a native brook trout fishery designated as a "kids only section" and being the only kid in the village who fished, George developed a passion for fly fishing. Through his early teens, much of his fly fishing knowledge was self taught. However, his family relocated to central PA when George was 14, where he eventually ran into his fly fishing idol, Joe Humphreys at a local fly shop. Joe took George under his wing and provided began providing his first formalized fly fishing instruction. Joe began to provide instruction on all levels (e.g. basic cast to advanced nymphing casts) when George was 16 years old. George credits Joe Humphreys for the bulk of his knowledge along with many national and international fly fishing professionals.

Then in 2005, George had an opportunity to try out for Fly Fishing Team USA in Bend, OR. After qualifying for the team, George had the opportunity to compete in 6 World

Fly Fishing Championships, coach both the US Youth

Team and Fly Fishing Team USA in 4 World Championships. During this time, George has had an opportunity to travel the globe and learn from some of the best anglers in the World.

George is a two-time US National Fly Fishing Champion and was ranked as high as 5th in the World. Currently, George is head coach for Fly Fishing Team USA.

George's passion is in fly fishing education, where he conducts lectures/seminars throughout the country. He logs over 200 days a year on trout waters near and far. George and had wife Amidea bought and restored an old home along his favorite trout stream, where they spend many hours with their two children walking along the banks, throwing stones, and sometimes even catching a fish. George is the author of the best selling book, "Dynamic Nymphing" along with being published in Fly Fisherman, American Angler and Fly Tyer magazines.

He's pro staffer for a number of fly companies including Simms, Orvis Fly Rods, Scientific Anglers, Smith Optics, Hatch Reels, Loon, Regal Vises. George is a fly designer for Umpqua Feather Merchants and recently joined the Fly Rod Chronicle's Pro Staff.


