

#### From the vest of the President



Rick Little once again provided a very informative presentation for our Zoom meeting in September. His photography and the content of his material was excellent. Last year he did a presentation for us focusing on fly fishing in Maine which was also excellent.

At our September BOD meeting we discussed the fact that the Veteran's Memorial Clubhouse is still in need of repairs. It will not be available for our CFFA monthly meetings for the remainder of 2021. After some discussion a motion was made and voted on to continue with the Zoom format for our October 13th meeting. The motion passed. The next day our Treasurer contacted East Hartford Park and Recreation and negotiated a deal that will allow us to conduct our monthly meetings in the auditorium at the East Hartford Cultural Community Center, 50 Chapman Place. The town currently allows 1/3 capacity or 100 people inside the facility and that number will accommodate us nicely with room to safely distance from each other if you choose to do so. So moving forward there is an opportunity for our November meeting to be our 1st social gathering in a long time. If we choose to act upon this opportunity we will follow the rules for indoor gatherings set forth by the town of East Hartford for their managed buildings and facilities. So if mask wearing is one of their rules everyone in attendance will need to wear one to enter the meeting. We really want to avoid any confrontations so if things work out and you make a decision to attend please follow the rules and do the best you can to keep yourself and your fellow fly fishers safe and healthy. If you don't want to follow the rules we would hope that you choose to not attend rather than create a confrontation.

Based on the above facts we would love to hear from all of our membership before we move forward. We would like to know, assuming a program is of interest to you, if you would attend a monthly meeting in person at 50 Chapman Place East Hartford during the current circumstances of the Pandemic. One new change is that when our future Expos and Banquets do resume they will need to be conducted in a different facility as the building where they were previously held has been sold and is no longer available. Kurt and Roger have been working on finding a new location for us. We are looking for a single location where we are able to hold both events on the same day as we have in the past.

I recently received a request for assistance from CFFA member Carl Swanson and I am hoping we can help him out. The following is his message. "Hey Gary, I hope all is well, I am looking to see if you can help me. I took over the role of Casting Partner Organizational lead from Jim Glowienka last year for CT Casting for Recovery. 
